Another place to go in Memphis is Nonconnah Creek. At Nonconnah Creek you can find a whole assortment of rocks, minerals and fossils. Some things that can be found there are mastodon teeth, fossilized wood, and geodes. It, as I would say, is a collector's heaven.

Chucalissa, as I mentioned in a former article, is a close to home Native American settlement. It is a great archaeological site to visit to learn about native Americans and their heritage.

There are many places that you can find rocks, minerals, and fossils in this area, but you need to make sure that you are not trespassing on private property.

A well known area for mineral hunting is Hot Springs. There you can find quartz, pyrite and magnetite. The beautiful specimens that you can find there are great additions to any collection.

Fossils are good specimens to add to your collection. A place where you can find fossils is the side of U.S. Highway 78 near mile marker 80 in Mississippi. There you can find fossils from the late Cretaceous period including exogyras, teeth, and Agerostreas. Be careful where you walk, because if you aren't, you'll step on hundreds of small fossils.

1. Must be a current, paid Junior member of a club in the Southeast Federation, 5
pointspoints
2. Must attend at least one adult meeting, 5 pointspoints
Attendance at additional adult meetings, 2 points eachpoints
(5 points if there is no Junior meeting available to attend)
3. Attendance at Junior meetings/workshops, 5 points eachpoints
Serving as an officer, committee member or presenter 5 points each meetingpoints
4. Attendance at a Gem and Mineral Club Show other than your own. Show must be recognized by an organized
Club or one of the major federations. (Obtain and save show ticket or program), 10
pointspoints
NOTE: Attendance at a primarily rock, gem, mineral, fossil, or earth science museum, National Park, or other
exhibit related to our hobby will be considered a "show". Enter points above, 10 points each
5. Participation in a Gem and Mineral Club sponsored (or Dixie Mineral Council sponsored) field trip, including
